

QUESTION ONE (COMPULSORY)

a)

- i. Define an influence line.
- ii. A U.D.L. of 50KN/M longer than the span rolls over a beam of 20m span. Using influence lines, determine the maximum shear force and bending moment at a section 10m from the left end support. (12mks)
- b) A simply supported beam of span 3m is subjected to a central point load of 10KN. Find the maximum slope and deflection of the beam. Take $I=12x10^6 mm^4$. (6mks)
- c) Draw the shear force and bending moment diagrams for the beam shown below using the three moment theorem.




QUESTION TWO

QUESTION THREE

- (a) A cantilever beam 2m long is subjected to a U.D.L. of 5KN/M over its entire length. Find the slope and deflection of the cantilever beam at its free end. Take $EI=2.5\times10^{12}mm^2$ (3mks)
- (b) A horizontal steel girder having a uniform cross-section is 14m long and is supported at its ends. It carries two concentrated loads as shown:






Calculate the deflection of the beam under the load C and D. Take E=200GPa, $l=160x10^6mm^4$ (17mks)

Using the moment distribution method draw the shear force and bending moment diagrams indicating critical values for the beam shown below:


