PROJECT

Eclectic Television News Production

This is a 10 minute screen time assignment. You will work in groups of 5 members. You will assign each member a specific task that will work towards the successful realisation of the project Goals.

Goals:

- Mix forms of news language according to the needs of your subject
- Direct a documentary with a screen time of exactly 10 minutes in length

Write a proposal

Meet as a group and consider the various ideas you have for a good TV news story. Select one good idea from the rest and do further research for information. Write a proposal to convince your reader (me) beyond the shadow of doubt that you can make a film of impact and significance.

Remember:

A good documentary:

- Tells a good story
- Changes us by evoking our emotions as well as by supplying a necessary framework of information and facts
- Usually takes a critical view of some aspect of the human condition
- Dramatizes human truths, both large and small, by showing them in action
- Usually needs you to supply the traditional dramatic ingredients –characters, exposition, building tension between opposed forces, confrontation, climax, and resolution.
- Is made from a passionate involvement

Steps:

- 1) Write a subject description and working hypothesis
- 2) Write a treatment by reworking your research material into a narrative. Write in the present tense, using a new paragraph for each sequence, describing only what will be seen and heard from the screen. Write evocatively, imagining where necessary what will happen so that the reader "sees" the attractive film that you hope and expect to make
- 3) Make a shooting schedule to show your shooting dates and arrangements.
- 4) Make a provisional budget covering all phases to indicate how you will fund your film
- 5) Obtain the permissions you need to shoot
- 6) Shoot
- 7) Edit first assembly
- 8) Fine cut
- 9) Show to one or more trial audience
- 10) Finalize sound by mixing and equalising tracks
- 11) Submit for evaluation
