a. Give any four types of clay roofing tiles. Explain how you would prevent leakages when using with clay tiles. (10marks)

b. What kind of hard woods are commonly used for joinery work in building construction sites.

- a. When constructing a bungalow, state the use of a ring beam and wall plate. (10 marks)
- b. Make a sketch diagram to show how the wall plate tiles the roof of the building to the wall and how it prevents lateral forces like winds. (10marks)

#### **Question FOUR**

- a. What items are mixed to make concrete?
- b. What reason is given for not recommending coral stone to be used as load bearing material in construction? (8marks)
- c. Give common sizes of building stones or concrete blocks used for construction of walls. (8 marks)

#### **Question FIVE**

- a. Briefly explain the duties of the clerk of works on a construction site. (10 marks)
- b. Explain what the clerk of works would be required to record on a daily basis on a construction site. (10marks)
