b. The following story was poorly written by an amateur reporter. Use the facts in the story to write a better one. Sticks to the facts provided. (20 marks)

Subject: Fire Disaster

Date: Today

Huge fire broke out at Harakati slum in Changamwe, 15 minutes to 11 am.

The locals who talked to *Mombasa Daily* said they heard a loud bang in one of the houses. A moment later a huge cloud of smoke appeared.

The fire spread fast to the neighbouring houses. Many of the houses are thatched with makuti.

Five people, two of them a mother and her five-year-old son, were seriously injured.

About 35 houses were razed down by the fire. This left over 100 people homeless.

"We lost everything except the cloths we're wearing. We do not know where to start our lives again," lamented Charo Karisa. He is a father of three. He has lived in the slum for 10 years.

Mombasa police boss Salim Musikari estimated the property loss at shs 50 million. Destroyed property include residential houses, several shops, kiosks and hardware shops.

The injured five people were rushed to Coast General Hospital. They were all admitted.

Tension gripped the area. It was unclear whether the fire was an act of arson. The police boss said investigations were ongoing to establish the true cause of the fire.

It took residents and fire brigade personnel from Mombasa municipality and the Kenya Airport Authority about one hour to extinguish it.
